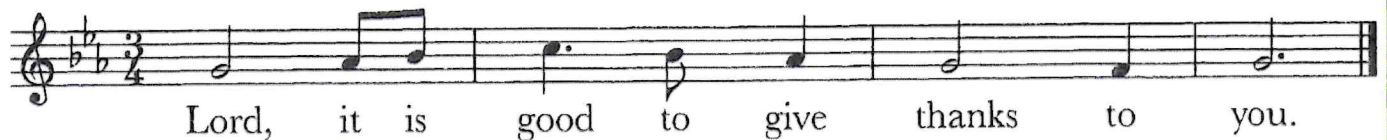

Coordinator's Corner

An athletic director I used to work with would often tell his players, "Point the thumb and not the finger." It was his way of reminding the athletes that when things weren't going well on the team, each person had to take a look in the mirror (point the thumb) rather than pointing fingers and blaming each other.

Too often, we're quick to point the finger and place the blame for our problems squarely on the shoulders of somebody else. "If this person wouldn't have treated me that way, I would not be having these problems." "If they would just do their job!" "If people would just leave me alone." We've all heard the phrases. Of course, people can be victimized and suffer from other's actions beyond their control. Pointing the thumb isn't always the best answer, but Jesus, in today's gospel, clearly admonishes those who complain about the other while ignoring the responsibility they have to "remove the log" from their own eye first.

It takes some emotional maturity and humility to recognize that I have a log in my eye. During difficult times, the emotionally mature person asks, "How have I contributed to this situation, and how can I be part of the solution?" The emotionally mature person seeks God's will and remains open to the gentle nudge of the Spirit to change an attitude or an approach.

Lent is a wonderful time to examine our emotional maturity and deepen our ability to follow Jesus' way of humility and forgiveness. I am hopeful that our small group discussion of Bishop Malesic's letter will be a pathway for this type of reflection, and I really encourage you to sign up for a small group. The letter is filled with small snippets waiting to be unpacked and explored. For example, Jessica Neuhart, our DRE, found this passage fruitful: "Have you ever noticed that the times in our lives when we grow the most, when we learn the most, and when we become more of who God made us to be are almost always preceded by some difficult time - some pain, sorrow, suffering, heartache, or loss? That's the Good Friday experience. When we stay faithful through those Good Friday experiences and trust that the Lord will raise us from the dead as he raised Jesus on Easter Sunday, we are able to experience the power of his Resurrection in our own lives." Imagine being able to talk about that in a small group!

Jesus calls us to life! A healthy spiritual life starts with the ability to "point the thumb", to accept our shortcomings and to work to identify the obstacles we create that keep us from deepening our relationship with God and others.

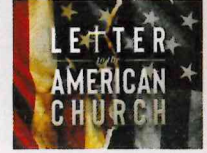

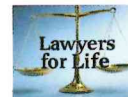
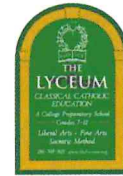
