Love Without Measure...

This past week the parish staff met with Maria O'Neil Ruddick and Kate Slosar to discuss: How we embrace

inclusivity: Serving Deaf and Hard of Hearing Parishioners. This is the first step in what I hope will be a growing dialogue among us as way of coming to a better understanding of the deaf and other groups with special needs within our parish family. It was an important first step and hopefully will lead to other opportunities to learn from each other. At the end of the meeting I asked the parish staff members present to comment about the gathering in a few short sentences and I make that my column for this Sunday's bulletin. ~ Fr. Bill ------ \rightarrow Trust is essential in all relationships but especially important in relationships where one party or group has a history of being ignored, excluded and misunderstood. Once lost, trust becomes elusive and difficult to reestablish. Often, the party or group in power must make sacrifices that seem disproportionately large or unrealistic. This is the Christian way modeled perfectly for us by the person of Jesus Christ. ~ Anthony _____ ⇒ Being aware of the needs of the Deaf Community should be an integral part of this church, and society as a whole. Understanding how and why Deaf persons act and do what they do are essential for everyone to know. Getting to know each other with open lines of communication will be a huge step in establishing trust and friendship. ~Bill We all desire access, belonging and feeling part of community. Society has many barriers, some that are more apparent to some than others. It is important to remember that Deaf people are visual people living in an audiological world. It is important to know that language is learned at an early age and without proper tools and environmental considerations a person can develop Language Deprivation Syndrome effecting their ability to communicate and understand. ~Bob "It's okay to have a disagreement in the Catholic Church." The Catholic Church has a long and proud history of disagreements throughout its 2000-year history.

- In the very beginning, Peter and Paul emphatically disagreed about the inclusion of gentiles in the early church.
- Later, The Council of Nicaea was convened because of a disagreement about nature of Christ.
- And even today there are some who still disagree with the change from the Latin Mass.

It's okay! The point is, disagreement is part of the natural growth and development of the Church. The fact that we can disagree, while still sharing our Love of Christ is where our strength comes from. This allows the Church to evolve and grow to meet the needs of an ever-changing community and world.

Recently, there have been some disagreements on how best to meet the needs of the Deaf Community while still managing parish growth and ensuring we are still positioned to meet the needs of a changing parishioner base.

But, even in the midst of these disagreements, the most important elements were never in question, those being, our unyielding love of Christ, and our love of each other. I am convinced, if that is all we have in common, it is more than enough.

After much consideration, Bishop Malesic has formally stated that the Deaf Ministry in the Diocese of Cleveland is to remain a Ministry of St. Augustine Parish. As Catholic's, the Bishops words are binding on all of us. This means, as a parish, we have an obligation to develop and maintain a strong and vibrant ministry to the Deaf Community, AND as members of the Catholic Church, the Deaf Community has an obligation to help, guide and cooperate with this ministry.

Parishes will always have disagreements, it is part of our passion to serve our Lord, but, it has always been our ability to come together in PRAYERFUL HUMILITY that is our strength. Recently, Father Bill brought in an advocate for the Deaf Community, along with our friend Kate Slosar, for a mandatory staff meeting so that we could all get an understanding of the challenges the deaf community faces each and every day. It was humbling and sometimes even hard to listen to. The deaf have been treated so poorly and even persecuted at times throughout history. This was insightful and helpful for all of us.

The parish staff are committed to developing a strong and vibrant ministry for the deaf that serves their needs alongside the rest of our wonderful community, together, the way our Lord intended it. Please join us in our mission of renewal of this wonderful ministry.

I do want to note, at the Council of Nicaea mentioned above, the disagreement became so heated that Bishop Nicholas got up, crossed the council chambers and slapped the Bishop from Egypt. The other bishops stripped him of his bishop's vestments, chained him, and threw him into jail.

Nicholas was ashamed and prayed for forgiveness. During the night, Jesus and Mary his Mother, appeared, asking, "Why are you in jail?" "Because of my love for you," Nicholas replied.

Jesus then gave the Book of the Gospels to Nicholas. Mary gave him vestments. Now at peace, Nicholas studied the Scriptures for the rest of the night.

When the jailer came in the morning, he found the chains loose on the floor and Nicholas dressed in bishop';s robes, quietly reading the Scriptures. When the Emperor was told of this, he asked that Nicholas be freed. Nicholas was then fully reinstated as the Bishop of Myra.
