Love Without Measure...

To appreciate today's gospel in which heals the beggar Bartimaeus, we should remember last week's gospel in which Jesus has a conversation with the apostles James and John. In both gospels Jesus asks the exact same question, "What do you want me to do for you?" But the answers in the two gospels are very different. James and John ask that thy sit at Jesus' right and left when he comes into his glory. Bartimaeus says, "Master I want to see." James and John ask for glory and power. Bartimaeus asks for sight and understanding. Jesus tells James and John that he cannot gran their request, but he immediately responds to Bartimaeus, and the beggar receives his sight.

When we place the two gospels side by side, they tell us that sight is more important than glory, that understanding is more to be desired than power. And this is an important message because you and I, like James and John, are attracted to power. We seek to make things happen, to get things done. We want the power to bring about that which is good. We look at our children and say, "I want to make sure that they grow into mature and successful adults." We look at someone we care for who is struggling with addiction and say, "I want to fix them." Today' gospel tells us that before we ask Jesus for the power to do things, we should first ask to see. We are called to see our children as the gifted and unique people that they are, because if we can love them as they are today, it is more likely that they will grow into the adults they need to be. We should see the person who is struggling with addiction as someone captive to fear and shame, because if we can recognize what enslaves a person and stand with them in their brokenness, it is more likely that they will be successful in recovery.

We look at the partisan divisions and the polarization that severely damages our politics during this present election season. When personal attacks and a complete disregard for the truth characterize our civil discourse, everyone ultimately loses, our nation can be irreversibly damaged and the freedom we, so value, put at risk. Even as our church continues to struggle with the issue of abuse, we hunger to have the power to fix the problem. Today's gospel tells us that before we ask for the power to do something, we should ask for the ability to see – to see the anger and prejudice that fuel the political divide, to see the root causes and sinfulness that allow abuse to continue. It is only when we see and understand the brokenness of our political and church systems that we will be able to rebuild them.

We are a little more than one week away from a very important national election that many say is the most important election of our lifetime. Vote early if you can or vote on November 5. The future of the nation rides on the commitment of our citizens to do their part. Do it not only for us but for our children and future generations.
