



Coordinator's Corner

This weekend marks the beginning of the holiest week in our liturgical year culminating in the celebration of the Easter Triduum. The word triduum comes from two Latin words, "tres" (three) and "dies" (day), and in this context refers to the one great festival celebrated across three days. Yes, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil (Holy Saturday) are truly one great celebration beginning on Thursday night and culminating in the joyous celebration of Jesus' resurrection on Holy Saturday.

I encourage each of you to seriously consider joining in these marvelous celebrations. The Mass on Holy Thursday begins at 7:00pm and is referred to as The Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified. The washing of the feet reminds us of our call to imitate Jesus' example of humble service.

Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated. Mass concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated Host is kept, away from the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated. People can remain in church until 11pm to pray, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemane for someone to "watch and pray" with Him.

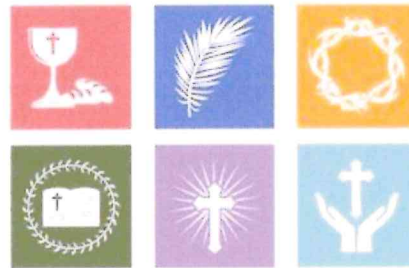
Our service on Good Friday begins at 7:00pm, and the altar looks very different: it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the main tabernacle, the candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning, prayer, fasting, and abstinence. The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass—it is a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which no Masses are offered.

Easter Vigil Mass begins at 9:00pm and is filled with symbolism and drama. We light the new fire, proclaim the power of light over darkness and recall God's saving action throughout history. We will welcome our sister, Cindy Lis into full communion with the Church, and share, with Christians all over the world, the glory of Jesus' resurrection. It's a powerful celebration!

I know it's late. I know they can last a while. Join us anyway!
Your presence does make a difference.
